Presenter

Seminar 9 will be delivered by *Sarah Wanjiru Mbira*, Director for Pendekezo Letu (PKL). Sarah has over 20 years' experience of working in child protection and safeguarding and 14 years' being a Director at PKL. With a background in Social Science, counselling and psychology, Sarah has vast experience of working with children and young people at risk in Kenya. Sarah has worked her way up from social worker, to senior social worker, programme coordinator to Director at Pendekezo Letu, enabling PKL to develop a holistic and inclusive approach.

Pendekezo Letu "Our Choice": Is a Kenyan NGO based in Nairobi delivering a variety of programmes to street connected children, young people and families in the city centre and slum settlements of Nairobi. PKL offers the following services for street connected children and young people; medical referral, counselling, recreation, family tracing and reintegration, street-based education, referral to schools, vocational training centres and the provision of business credit to small groups of children who choose not to leave the streets.
